We are coming to the end of a European Social Fund Project funded through Staffordshire Community Foundation. The project, called WELLIES 4 Work aims to develop the skills and confidence of people with long-term mental ill health who are getting ready to return to work or volunteering.

The project has been a real success with participants visibly developing in confidence after attending just a few sessions. They have taken part in a wide and diverse range of activities including driving a mini digger, willow work, fresh flower designs for Easter, planting an edible hedge, sausage making, bread making, fishing, sowing seeds, taking cuttings and much more. The group have also been actively involved in renovating an old farm building to create a new space for community and group use, fondly known as Project Pig Sty.

WELLIES Stands for Wellness, Education, Learning, Laughter, Inspiration, Environment and Skills. It provides therapeutic activities with animals, plants and the countryside. We are shortly to start another three short projects in Whittington, Sudbury and South Staffordshire funded by The Community Learning Fund through Staffordshire County Council.

We work in partnership with Quest Day Opportunities, who support individuals mental health needs and progress towards recovery during WELLIES Projects.

Care Farming Development

Julie and Nick continue to be active in the promotion of skills for care farming and have created good links with many UK and European Care Farms through their work. Linking care farming to social enterprise activity seems to be the key to success for many and making sure that income is derived from diverse sources.

Teaching Literacy and Numeracy on the Farm A Grundtvig Workshop for European Learners

In October this year, Growing Rural Enterprise will host a workshop for people who teach Literacy and Numeracy. The participants will be from various European Countries and looking for innovative ways to teach and engage adults in lifelong learning. Through embedding these skills in activities such as fishing, woodland management, horticulture and agriculture, the group will share ideas and good practice. They will return home with a tool kit of ideas to use in the everyday teaching.

Embedding Literacy and Numeracy skills into practical activities engages those who wouldn't usually attend classroom based formal learning and brings new people into learning which is a priority for this years workshops.

Making Local Food Work The Plunckett Foundation

We are Enterprise Support Advisors for Making Local Food Work and through this project provide support to social enterprise food based businesses. Some of the businesses we've worked with recently include Horton Community Farm, a garden based project for people recovering from mental ill health in Bradford, Willows Care Farm, who are working alongside Canalside Community Food in Redford Semele, Warwickshire. Food 4 Thought Café in Stafford and Rea Valley Produce Market.

The support offered is tailor made to meet the needs of each enterprise; typically this is help with marketing, income generation, cash flows and general business planning.

Therapy Dog Project - TeD

We visited Lodz University in Poland recently to meet up with partners in this Leonardo Transfer of Innovation Project. There are partners from Italy, Germany, Spain, Poland and UK.



Early in 2014, each partner country will run a pilot course to develop the skills of a group who will become dog handlers for therapy dogs. Centro Pet Therapy in Italy is sharing their innovative practice and their course will be adapted to suit the needs of each country, before it is piloted next year.

Nick is currently researching similar projects in the UK and European partners are doing the same. A steering group of stakeholders, meet every three months, they are interested people, potential course attendees and businesses who are using Dog Therapy such as Brighter Futures (www.brighterfuturescounselling.co.uk) in Ashbourne where Frances Weston uses her dog Tilly to help in her sessions with children and adults.
